thousands of team members from around the world - all building something the industry has never seen before. Icon, and her sisters, are a testament to the enduring legacy of innovation that began in 1970 with the introduction of the Song of Norway.

The Beginning - Song of Norway

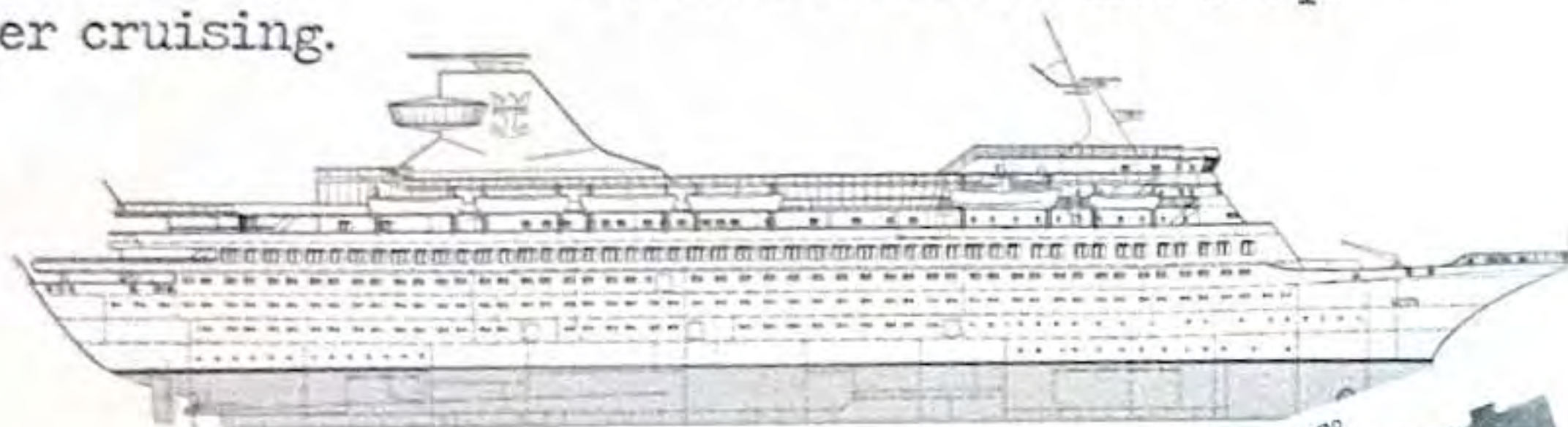

In 1982, Royal Caribbean set sail with the Song of America, a ship larger than her sisters and featuring a redesigned Viking Crown Lounge positioned around the ship's funnel - a design so iconic that it lasts to this day and is featured by many in the Royal Caribbean fleet.

To continue its rapid expansion and grow, Royal Caribbean partnered with more builders throughout Europe. Working with the Saint-Nazaire shipyard in France, Royal Caribbean created the first mega-ship, Sovereign of the Seas.

The Millennium - Voyager Class

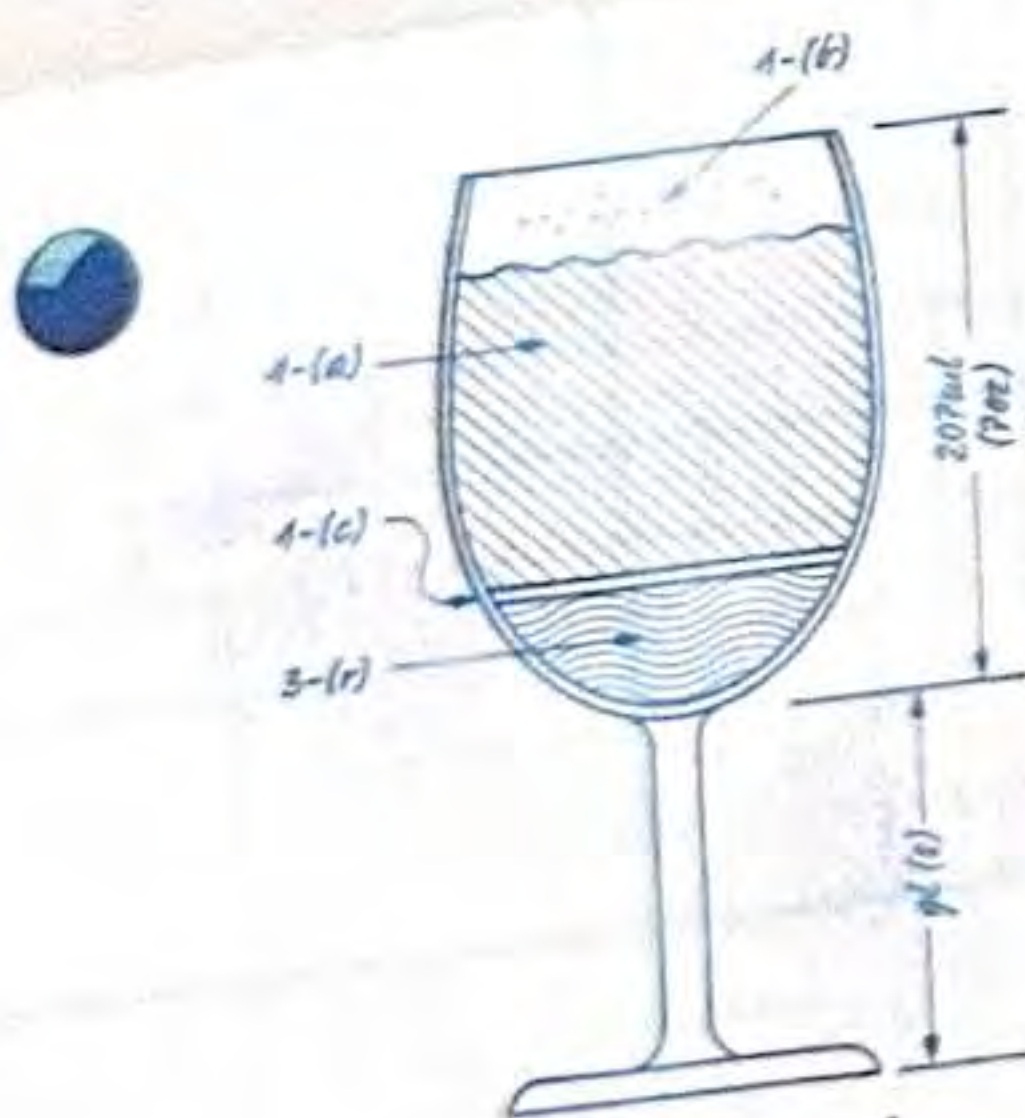
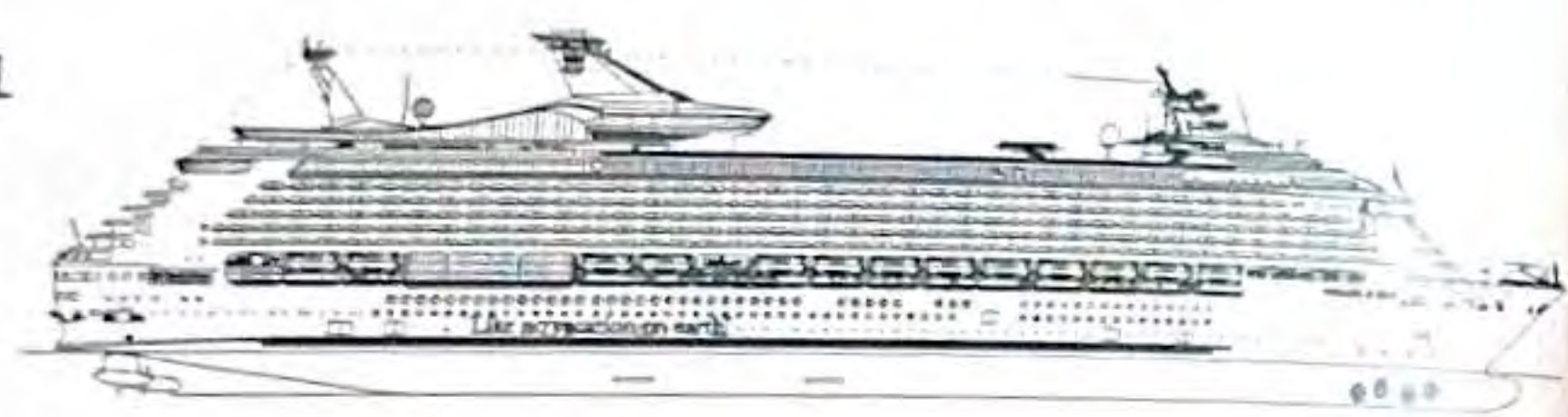

Freedom of the Seas bears a striking resemblance to her older sisters, the Voyager Class, in terms of its structure, shape, and overall design.

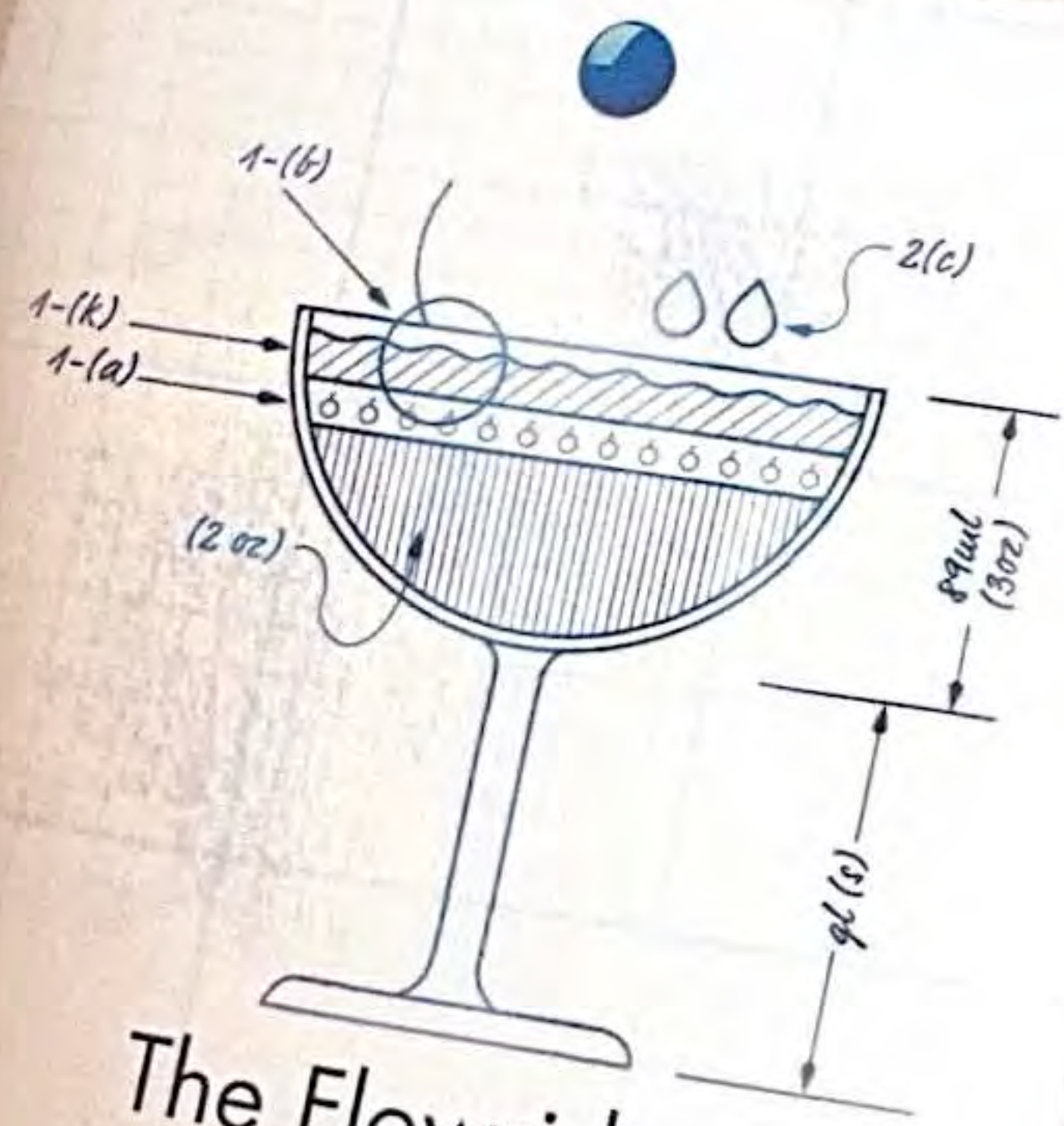
However, Freedom's secret is an additional 91 feet of space dedicated to enhancing guest experiences and providing unexpected thrills.

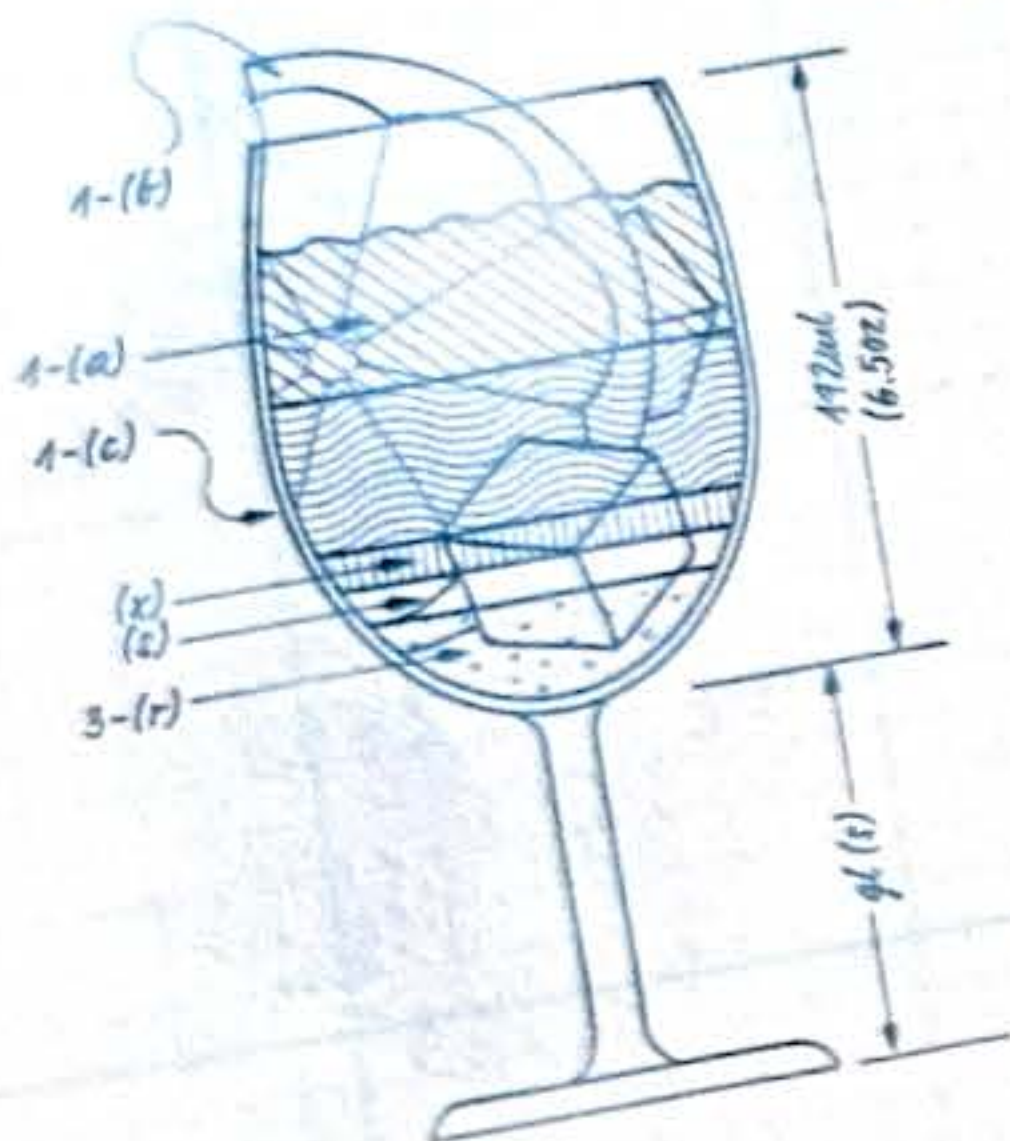

The Original Gamechanger - Oasis Class

The Oasis class (codename Project Genesis) took the industry by storm when Oasis of the Seas was introduced in 2009. Oasis, and her sister Allure, redefined the playbook of a modern cruise ship, introducing jaw-dropping WOWs that have since become a staple for Royal Caribbean.

Oasis was the first cruise ship featuring a split superstructure, allowing for never-before-seen open-air atriums in more areas of the ship, providing designers with unprecedented opportunities for creativity and to innovate the guest experience.

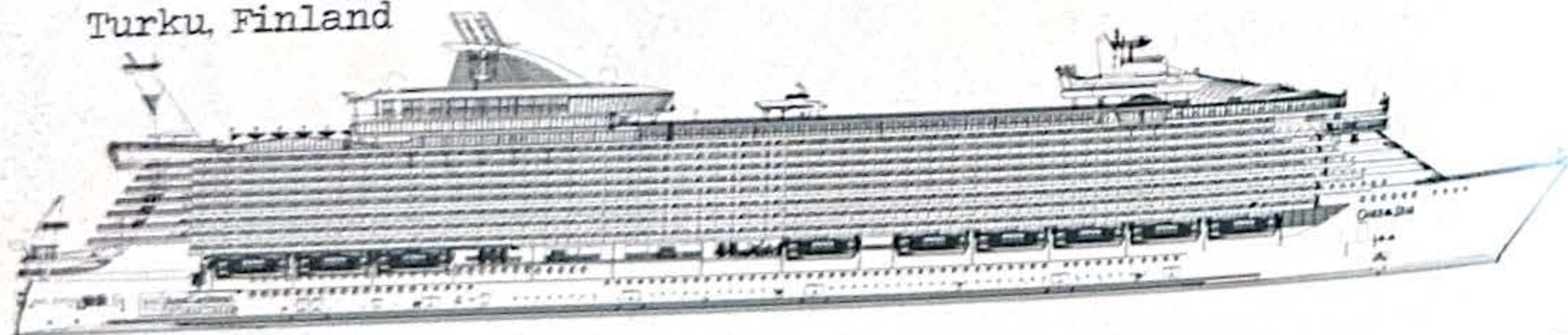
